# Online Dungeons & Dragons at Easton Library



In an effort to engage teens, Easton Library is forming a D&D gaming group. The New York Library Association offered a free webinar to libraries interested in starting up a D&D fantasy or space adventure role-playing game online. Dungeons and Dragons was first published in 1974 and it has now emerged more frequently in pop-culture. It is a social interactive experience perfect for when people want to "stay at home". They can also "play at home". A team of people are required to play either daring hero's or sometimes, villains. Players get to encounter the world and overcome a debacle experience with shared maps and shared rules. There is a Dungeon Master who is the referee and has story hooks that makes the play run smoothly. The rules are fun and inclusive.
